How Success Leads to Relapse

"My life is so good now that I'm sober. So why am I so miserable?" This was my story, over and over again. I destroy my life with drugs and alcohol. I get sober, my job, my relationships and my finances improve rapidly. I start feeling good about myself and my place in the world. I do everything I am supposed to do to stay sober: steps, service, meetings, etc. How is it that I inevitably fail? How is it that after even years of abstinence, I end up deciding that a little bit won't hurt or that no one will know? With all of the great decisions I make sober, how is it that I end up right back where I was...and worse?

I have had the benefit of being able to look at my decisions and my resulting failure after not having a drug or drink in my body for many years and still ending up loaded. I need to understand the true nature of my disease and how it is possible to forget or disbelieve that I have lost the power of choice. Not just after I have relapsed but, I seem to lose the power of choice while completely sober!

Humility is a guiding spiritual principle that is found throughout the 12 step principles. My experience shows me that the better my life gets, the closer I am to destruction if I lose humility. As life got good, I lost the desperation I had when I once again sought help. Desperation is what motivates me to follow the direction I was given. Without that motivation, I focused more on making money and doing the things I thought were important, and less and less on learning how to enhance my spiritual condition. The reality is that without a spiritual path, I am or soon will be lost for I have lost the ability to stay stopped.

Looking back over the decades of failure in recovery, I finally came to the stark realization that I am an addict of the hopeless variety as described in the Big Book. I never drank to excess but I smoked crack alcoholically and crossed that line from which I can never go back. I was the crackhead pickle that didn't believe I could not return to being a normal cucumber. Once I realized the truth about my disease, it scared me allowing me to regain that gift of desperation. I became motivated to learn how to thoroughly follow the path which had freed so many of the people I knew from the prison of addiction. I had finally understood Step One as it relates to me. I then became willing to find a power greater than myself, a God of my own understanding.

HOW I FOUND HOPE

There truly is hope in C.A. I know that if I can stay sober you can too. C.A. NewsGram, 2nd Quarter 1999

When I first walked into the rooms of C.A. I had no hope of ever having a life that did not include cocaine. I certainly did not believe in a Higher Power and didn't think anything could or would change my life. What I heard in that first meeting did change my life. These people had once been as hopeless as I was but said they had found a solution. As I listened to people share what had happened to them and how their lives had changed, I began to feel hope.

I actually thought that if this could work for them, and if they didn't have to get loaded in order to live and deal with life, that there certainly was hope for me. So I kept coming back to the meetings. I did what others told me to do: get a sponsor; read the *Big Book*; work the Steps of the program; and try to cultivate a belief in a Power greater than myself. I started to do these things, and soon my life began to change. I got a part-time job, my kids wanted to be around me again, and my family relationships started to heal. As time went on, I got more involved in the program, the meetings, and service work.

Carrying this same message of hope to others became an important part of primary purpose. I have stayed sober since I walked into my first meeting nearly thirty years ago. My life has changed in so many ways. I have my family completely back, and I have a career that I love. I have friends that are always there for me no matter what, and I have relationships that are built on friendship, trust, and love. I would not have any of these things if I didn't feel the hope in that first meeting. That same sense of hope has been present in every meeting that I've attended since that first day.

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An important part of my primary purpose is to carry the message of hope that was carried freely to me. Hope is no longer an abstract concept; it has become a reality.

#### ... and expanding!

When I came to California 14 months ago, I was broken into a million pieces. I was lost and scared; my mind was going so many different places. Once the fog lifted and things were starting to get clearer, I did everything my sponsor told me to do: Get commitments, sponsor other women, get involved in meetings and Panels. I was introduced to H&I while I was still in detox. They held panels at our houses and every week there were different speakers. They would tell their stories, sharing their experience, strength, and hope with us. Around the middle of this sobriety, my friend had a literature commitment on the H&I board, and he started bringing me with him each week. I would just sit there and listen, until one day one of my sober brothers volunteered me to be Literature Assistant. I had only had 6 months of sobriety at the time. I would help with pamphlets, and accompany my friend to the World Service Office, which was really cool to see. From there, I just did what I was asked, and now I am now the Treasurer and Secretary of H&I. The amount of work we put into giving back to our members, putting on events, and going into institutions where our fellow addicts are not able to get out yet, is one of the most rewarding experiences. H&I has helped me in my sobriety 100%. It helps keep me going and stay sober. I get to be part of something bigger than myself and give back. I plan on helping the H&I board for as long as I can. I put just as much into this as I would my addiction because it is a vital part of my recovery to be able to go into these places and give back what was so freely given to me.


